Chelsea Spear is an independent filmmaker who has directed two short films, "Alphabet" and The Hidden, and two installations, "Films About Water"

and "Orangutan". Her work has screened at venues throughout the country and around the world, from Ladyfest Austin to the side of a tall building in Zurich to the Public Library in her native Boston. She has also worked as a production assistant on numerous other films, including the acclaimed documentary *My Father The Genius* and Alexandre Rockwell's DV feature *13 Moons*.

Jennifer Pelland is a Boston-area writer who shares her home with an Andy and three cats. Her short fiction has appeared in *Strange Horizons, Escape Pod, Apex SF and Horror Digest*, and *Here and Now*. Lindsay Ellison is narrator, director, editor, improv performer, teacher, and published and recorded songwriter and poet. She has narrated over 150 audio books in all genres from textbooks to children's books to bestsellers, including those for the Library of Congress/National Library Service, Perkins School for the Blind, and various major publishers in Boston and NYC. She is an improvisational storyteller, a spokesperson for art and literacy on several New England TV stations, is on the Board of Directors for the National Audio Theatre Festivals, and coaches "The Art of Narration" and "Writing for Audio" nationally. When she is not working as a narrator, storyteller, voice coach, or performer, Lindsay is a dancer/choreographer, percussionist, and teacher of media literacy to youth.

Renée Johnson is an anthropologist, executive assistant, nature photographer and aspiring ballad scholar. Her wish is to keep the work of Francis James Child, a nineteenth century folklorist whose collection *The English and Scottish Popular Ballads* remains the definitive work on the subject, alive and well in the world. Renée's own research analyzes the ties between these western European ballads and those that have survived in the oral traditions of Appalachia. She will hopefully be presenting her first paper on the subject at a national conference in February. (Wish her luck!)
